Submission Guidelines

Rheumatology fellows and junior faculty from across the country are invited to submit abstracts of their original basic or clinical research findings or interesting case reports.

The top ten abstracts deemed to be most exceptional will be invited for oral and poster presentations and receive a stipend of \$1000 each. The next fifteen will be invited to give a poster ± an oral presentation and will each receive a travel stipend of \$500. Five remaining abstracts will be chosen to receive honorable mention and a travel/meeting stipend of \$250. Notification of abstract acceptance for oral or poster sessions as well as ranking and/or award will be made by email by April 2, 2020.
